


Is your PICC tip in the SAFE ZONE?



The catheter tip position with the greatest safety profile is the Cavoatrial Junction (CAJ).






If the catheter tip *migrates out 4 - 8cms*, only isotonic solutions should be infused. If irritant or vessicant solutions i.e. Parenteral Nutrition are required, the *PICC must be removed* to prevent complications such as vessel erosion, perforation or DVT.

Replace PICC if still required.

If the catheter tip *migrates out 8cms or* greater, **REMOVE PICC**. **Replace PICC if still required.**



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If the catheter tip *migrates out 2cms* continue to use, but monitor for any further migration.
