

Nursing Entry to Practice Programme (NetP)

The NetP Programme provides support and socialisation for new nurses to further develop their critical thinking, decision making and confidence in their first year of practice.

Support can be provided for facilities who have newly graduated nurses who qualify for HWNZ funding for NetP, however support may also be available for those who do not meet this criteria.

If you have a vacancy and are thinking of employing a newly graduated RN, please contact the Nurse Coordinator for Nursing Workforce Development – ARC as there are resources and support available for you.
